Join Friends of the Mississippi River for a Storm Drain Stenciling Outing

WHO: Scout Troops, Clubs, Schools,
Community Groups, Churches,
Corporations, Families, Individuals, etc.

**WHAT: Storm Drain
Stenciling Project** - volunteers
paint the message "Please, Don't Pollute!
Drains to River" next to
storm drains and distribute
educational doorhangers to
neighborhood homes and
businesses.



WHERE: Your group's neighborhood
in Minneapolis, St. Paul, and within the
Minnehaha Creek Watershed District.
(**No transportation necessary!**)

WHEN: April through October
(Weather permitting)

WHY: To prevent urban runoff
pollution from entering the storm
sewer system. Many residents do not
realize that storm drains provide a
direct route for pollutants to enter the
river. This activity educates
community members about the
importance of protecting
the watershed, and what
we can all do to help keep it
clean and safe for the
future.

HOW: Friends of the Mississippi River
staff will train your group and provide
an educational presentation on urban
runoff pollution. Individuals or smaller
groups can participate at community
stenciling events or arrange to pick up
equipment and instructions. Stenciling
supplies are provided free of charge.



Specifics to Help You Plan Your Stenciling Outing

Time Commitment - One outing usually
lasts between one and three hours, depending
on how much time you have.

Weather - If it's raining or wet we cannot
stencil. We'd be happy to schedule a rain date.

Supervision - Children must be
supervised for this activity. We recommend
one adult for every five to ten children

Group Size - For groups of 10 people or
more, we will meet you or your group and bring
the equipment. Groups of less than 10 will need
to arrange to pick up and drop off the
stenciling equipment.

Clothing: Make sure you wear old clothes —
PAIN WILL NOT WASH OUT!
